

GRANT PAYMENTS


By Geography Served (2016)



Payments to support Native Nations totaled \$4.6M, or 13%. This amount is included in the MN/ND/SD amounts above. Per capita this is \$20.29.

Bush Foundation Funding in North Dakota | 2012-2016

We have given \$17M to individuals and organizations in North Dakota in the past 5 years. That represents 11% of our total giving. (North Dakota represents 10% of the population in our region.)



Community Innovation

28 projects have received CI Grants totaling \$4.5M and 9 Bush Prize winners have received a total of \$3M. In partnership with the Consensus Council and the ND Community Foundation we have funded 101 small CI grants totaling more than \$947K.

Education

Our largest current grant relationships are with the Standing Rock Sioux Tribe for a Lakota/Dakota Language Institute and to North Dakota State University to support the use of data to inform teacher training.

North Dakota Bush Prize Winners | 2012-2016

We've awarded 9 North Dakota organizations the Bush Prize, with grants totaling \$3M

The Bush Prize for Community Innovation honors and supports innovative organizations with a track record of making great ideas happen. Winners receive a package of recognition, including a flexible grant of 25 percent of the organization's last fiscal year budget, up to \$500,000.
